

TBA has always been committed to making barrier removal a priority in all its projects. We have designed renovations to provide access improvements to dozens of public buildings including municipal office and assembly buildings, public safety facilities, churches, schools, libraries, teaching and research laboratories, and a wide variety of service and utility structures. Our accessibility designs for private clients include office and commercial buildings, private residences, multi-family and senior housing facilities, hotels, and recreational, industrial and manufacturing facilities.

Our projects have included ramps, elevators, and fully reconfigured entries for the municipalities of Boston, Cambridge, Gardner, Holbrook, Newton, Waltham, Wareham, Weston and Westford as well as for state authorities and colleges. In a survey compiled for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts DCAM, TBA examined over sixty existing public safety facilities in Worcester County and outlined their ADA nonconformities. Also for DCAM, TBA has planned and designed access renovations for the 541,000 square foot Middlesex High Rise Courthouse in East Cambridge.

TBA believes "accessibility projects" do not need to be considered an after-the-fact fix to accommodate the minority of our population with special needs. Rather they represent an opportunity to meet an important public purpose: to assure that all members of the public are fully respected and feel a genuine invitation into our public facilities.
